While serving in these positions she was also active chairing the following committees - hospital visiting, decorating, Remembrance Day, Colour Party, Ways and Means - where she looked after the bake and craft sales, meat raffles, Kid's Halloween and Christmas parties.

She is also very active with the Army Cadets where she takes the cadets on trips as a driver and chaperon. They do bottle drives and raffles to raise money. Joanne has been very involved as a community member and with the school. She has been a bus driver since 1985 and goes on school field trips as driver and chaperon.
